#### **CYO TRACK AND FIELD CELEBRATES 50TH**



The Mercer County CYO celebrated their 50th Annual CYO Track and Field Meet on Sunday, May 22 at Notre Dame High School in Lawrenceville, NJ. This year there were 7 schools and parishes that competed in the meet and they included: Our Lady of Sorrows / St. Anthony's, St. Ann's, St. Gregory's, St. Mary's of Bordentown, St. Paul's, St. Raphael's / Holy Angels and Trenton Catholic Academy. The day included 28 running events (100 Meter Dash, 400 Meter Run, 50 Meter Dash, 400 Meter Relay, 800 Meter Run, 75 Meter Dash, 200 Meter Run, 4 x 50 Shuttle Relay and the Sprint Medley) and 20 field events (Long Jump, Shot Put, Jump Rope, Soccer Kick, Softball Throw, Baseball Throw and the Football Throw) for the 4 divisions (GJV, BJV, GV & BV). The top 3 finishers in each event received ribbons for their achievement. Trenton Catholic Academy took home the 1st place trophy with 124 points as they defended their title by winning this year's meet. St. Gregory's came in 2nd place with 101 points followed by St. Paul's with 87 points in 3rd place. At this year's meet, there

were 2 CYO records that were broken. In the BJV Shot Put, Justin McClellan of TCA set a new record with a distance of 31' 1" breaking the previous record of 25' 1 ½" and in the Girls Varsity 200 Meter Dash, Whitney Gittens of TCA set a new record with a time of 30.3 seconds breaking the previous record of 30.6 seconds. Congratulations to all of this year's participants!

#### **EWING PRESCHOOL @ HOLLOWBROOK**

Springtime is always buzzing with activity. Of course, the Easter Bunny made his visit to the center to hide his eggs. The Ewing CYO center was chosen to participate in a project called NAP SACC - Nutrition and Physical Activity Self-Assessment for Child Care; it involves training and

technical assistance to improve nutrition and physical activity practices and policies at the center. This project is part of a larger initiative happening around the state called Shaping NJ. As part of this initiative parents and children participated in yoga classes during February and March. Another one of our goals was to hold a Healthy Snack Festival. It was held on April 28th. Children made an assortment of healthy snacks that they shared with their families. At the festival a table was available for parents to test their knowledge of healthy portions and serving size. A nurse was available to give blood pressure screenings. Recipe books were given to families. Activities that promote movement and exercise were also available. We charted how often do our families eat fast food during the week. During our training sessions provided by Child Care Connection, we learned how to choose a healthier menu for our children and new ideas for providing healthy exercise and fitness activities.

In May, children went to a farm to pick strawberries. As they begin their unit on insects, they will also be caring and watching caterpillars as they change from caterpillar to chrysalis to butterfly. This science activity is accompanied with various literacy activities especially their favorite book, *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* by Eric Carle.

#### **TRENTON PRE-SCHOOL**

The CYO Preschool also recently participated in the Early Mercer County Reads Day on April 14th. Parents were invited to come in and read to their children's class-rooms. Over 1,000 Mercer County children participated in this event by simultaneously participating by having stories read to them.

#### **GRANTS AWARDED**

The following grants have recently been awarded: The Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) awarded \$1,500 for a new freezer for the CYO Center. Mercer County awarded a grant in the amount of \$58,000 per year for a two year period (2011 and 2012) to be applied to the Trenton Non-Abbott Pre-School, ASP, REC, and the Ewing Pre-School and Summer Camp. The Trenton ASP Tutoring component received \$3,000 from the Linoowitz Family Foundation, \$1,000 from Church & Dwight, \$2,500 from the Arvesen Fund of the Community Foundation of NJ, and \$1,000 from Provident Bank Foundation. The James Kerney Foundation continued its generosity with a \$20,000 grant for a new bus, and the Trenton and Ewing Pre-Schools were accepted into the PNC Bank's Grow Up Great Program.
