PRINCETION AREA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION AWARDS GRANT TO SOUTH BROAD STREET GENTIER

A \$25,000 grant was awarded to CYO's Broad St. Trenton Center after school and summer day camp programs, from the Princeton Area Community Foundation (PACF).

CYO has operated its Broad St. After School Program since 1976 and the summer Recreational/ Educational Camp since 2001. The programs are designed to provide positive activities for children. during crucial non-school hours, to engage them, stimulate their interests & provide alternative to "hanging out" unsupervised, leaving them vulnerable to less savory choices like crime, substance abuse & gang involvement. Availability of subsidies & transportation, as well as continuing efforts at programming expansion & facility improvements, contribute to making CYO's programs essential elements of area families' childcare plans.

CYO Executive Director, Tom Mladenetz, notes, "Nearly 100% of CYO's Broad St. Trenton Center participants are from working families who depend on CYO for affordable childcare, and we are thrilled that the Princeton Area Community Foundation recognizes this and has chosen to generously support CYO in our efforts."
