

# YARDVILLE DAY CAMP GAINS AMERICAN CAMP ASSOCIATION RE-ACCREDITATION

The CYO Yardville Day Camp recently received the prestigious honor of their American Camp Association re-accreditation and now will remain accredited through August 31, 2022! The ACA accreditation is considered the gold seal in the camping industry and the Yardville Day Camp has been accredited since 1998. The CYO was visited in early July by a group of Camp Directors, and was scored on and met over 300 standards in Transportation, Food Service, Health and Wellness, Aquatics, Human Resources, Operation Management, Program Design, and Program Challenge Course, scoring 100% for the second consecutive cycle. The standards scored ensure that all aspects of the camp are happening in a safe and healthy environment and that the staff working have been properly trained for their duties.

On Thursday, October 26, we joined our friends from East State Street at a special Halloween Party given by the students at Stuart Country Day School in Princeton. Everyone had a terrific time and the children and staff from both centers were happy to see old friends once again! On Monday, October 30, our older class had the opportunity to join their friends at East State Street once again for the PNC Grow Up Great Planetarium, which teaches pre-school children about the sun, moon and stars and features several of the characters from Sesame Street.

It's great to be back home again! We're looking forward to the ongoing growth of our pre-school program and the re-establishment of our summer camp for children ages 6-10 this coming June. Children who attend the summer camp will have the chance to enjoy our upgraded pool facility which features a splash pad for the younger children and increased shallow area in the main pool area, making it much more user friendly for the majority of the campers. We are looking forward to the days ahead which promise growth and fun times at our newly renovated Ewing facility.
